

PERMANENT COSMETICS PRE-PROCEDURE INFORMATION

1. All permanent cosmetic procedures are multi-session processes. You are required to come back for at least one touch-up visit before it can be determined that your work is complete. Touch-up visits are scheduled at 4–6-week intervals or longer, this depends on the clients ages. Clients 30 to 40 years old 4 weeks, 50 to 60 years old 6 1/2 weeks successively
2. Be prepared for the color intensity of your procedure to be significantly sharper, brighter, or darker than what is expected for the final outcome. It will take time for this transition, based upon how quickly the outer layer of your skin exfoliates.
3. While these tattooed colors may initially simulate the exact color and tone desired, they will not always remain a perfect match. Tattooed colors are constant, while your own skin color will vary depending on exposure to cold, heat, sun and circulatory changes even stress. For example, if you tan your skin and had a scar camouflaged, your surrounding skin will be darker in appearance than the treated area.
4. Since delicate skin or sensitive areas may swell slightly or redden, some clients feel it best not to make any social plans for two to five days following any procedure. It is always best to avoid these procedures within months prior to important life events such as surgeries, vacation and weddings. Procedures may take longer than expected to be complete under some circumstances.
5. This process takes from 2 ½ to 3 ½ hours (time varies depending in the clients needs) per procedure, plan accordingly since this work cannot be rush.
6. Wear clothes that you don't care about since some pigment may get on your garment.
7. Being in a laying position for a long time can cool your body, we recommend bringing a small cover to warm you up.
8. We recommend washing your hair prior the procedure since we highly recommend not to wash your hair after the procedure for about 3 days. This will avoid for water and steam to get on the procedure area.
9. Wear your normal makeup and bring your lip color, brow or eyeliner pencils (whichever one apply)to the day of the procedure.
10. Abstain from any tweezing or waxing before the procedure; electrolysis no less than five days before. Do not resume any method of hair removal for at least two weeks.
11. **Avoid products containing Retinoids/Retinol, Glycolic, Alicyclic Acids, Acids, Skin brightener, Dermatologist creams and/or other exfoliating products, chemical peels**
12. Botox procedure can be done 4 ½ prior or after procedure
13. Clients coming out of chemotherapy, heart problem, high blood pressure/high blood pressure medication must bring a release doctors note prior booking, skin related conditions need Dr release note to book an appointment

14. Any eyelash or eyebrow tinting, or eyelash curling should be done no sooner than 48 hours before, or two weeks after the procedure. Fake eyelashes need to be remove one week prior to eyeliner procedure
15. Menstrual cycles, appointment should be done 5 days prior or after your cycle.
16. "IF APPLY" Do not wear contact lenses during or immediately following the eyeliner procedure.
Remember to bring your glasses. You may resume wearing your contact lenses as soon as your eyes return to their pre-tattooed condition.
17. Following the eyeliner procedures, as a safety precaution, we recommend that you have someone available to accompany you or drive you home **if need be.**
18. If you are having lip procedures and have any history of cold sores/fever blisters/herpes simplex, you will be required to contact your physician to obtain the proper prescription to prevent such outbreaks. I highly recommend the use of **Abreva** cream 1 day before, during and after procedure to avoid outbreaks.
19. Refrain from the consumption of alcohol, aspirin, aspirin-containing medications, ibuprofen, or other blood-thinning medications for 3 to 2 days before any procedure. Refrain from judgment-altering drugs for at least 48 hours prior to any procedure. **No medication should ever be discontinued without first consulting your physician.**
20. A skin test is offered upon request for clients that:
 - a. is their first time getting their skin pigmented or tattoo
 - b. had allergic reaction to cosmetic makeup. (make the technician aware if you have any allergy reaction to cosmetic makeup before booking an appointment).
